

WISCONSIN SCHOOL CHOICE PROGRAM

How to Qualify and How to Apply

What is the Wisconsin School Choice Program?

The state of Wisconsin has a program that allows eligible students to attend a participating private school in grades four-year-old kindergarten (K4) to 12. The private school, on behalf of the student's parent or guardian, receives a state aid payment for each eligible student.

How is a Family Eligible?

Student eligibility is based on a combination of student residency, income and age. Students must also be applying to certain grades or have met a prior year requirement.

What is the Residency Requirement?

All students must provide documentation that they live in the State of Wisconsin. Acceptable documentation includes utility bills, W2's, mortgages.

What is the Income Requirement?

New Choice students must provide income documentation showing that the family income does not exceed the income limits. Those limits for 2022-23 are:

- One Person - \$28,336
- Two People - \$38,324
- Three People - \$48,312 (single) or \$55,312 (married)
- Four People - \$58,300 (single) or \$65,300 (married)
- Five People - \$68,288 (single) or \$75,288 (married)
- Six People - \$78,276 (single) or \$85,276 (married)

What are the Age Requirements?

Students ages 4 through 20 on or before September 1 are eligible to apply for the Choice program. Additionally, a student must be at least the following age on or before September 1: 4 years old for K4, 5 years old for K5 and 6 years old for grade 1.

How Do I Apply?

Each year, all students must apply at dpi.wi.gov/choice.
The application period begins February 1, 2022.

Current Choice Families are required to re-apply but will only need to provide residency verification.
